USING THIS FIELD GUIDE

Maintaining regular rhythms of prayer and Bible reading aren't easy. It starts with the heart. We must see our desperate need. We must turn from things that won't satisfy to the one, living, true God who fills our hunger and quenches our thirst. We must pursue hearing from Him in His word, and responding to that revelation in prayer, even when we may not feel like it, which is quite often.

However, our problem often isn't so much a lack of motivation as it is the absence of a good method. The purpose of this booklet is to give you such a method. It isn't perfect. It's not for everyone. However, if followed semi-regularly and somewhat-faithfully, it will certainly put you in front of the God who has saved you and will transform you.

If you haven't noticed, as we gather on Sundays as God's people, we follow a liturgy, an order of worship. To be sure, every church has a liturgy; some are just more intentional and more faithful than others. The goal of our liturgy in Karis Church is to appropriately guide us to our holy Lord and help us experience the wonder and joy of the gospel. This is a personal liturgy of sorts. It's meant to be a resource as you pursue God privately. It may also be helpful as you worship as a family or in your missional community.

In addition, both a morning and evening prayer pathway are provided. Throughout the ages, God's people have come before their Lord according to certain rhythms. One such tradition has been labeled the Daily Office. The Jewish synagogue and the early church both approached God in prayer and worship at certain, set hours of the day. This guide provides two recommended, guided times of prayer. Utilizing a liturgy such as this, and at set hours of the day, when done under the grace of God, can give us a sense of regularity and stability in our spiritual life.

This booklet provides a simple, step-by-step guide for daily prayer and worship. It gives you an outline as you seek to hear from God in His word and respond to Him in prayer. As you embark on this journey with Him, here are some things to keep in mind.

1. Read through each section of the liturgy, along with the passages of Scripture, slowly, meditatively, and prayerfully. Try not to rush. It is better to finish half the liturgy with the heart engaged than to rush through it all mindlessly.

2. This is not a Bible reading plan. If you do choose to read all the passages listed, you will read through the Old Testament once, the New Testament twice, and the Psalms five times. However, the goal of this booklet is to serve as a field guide for worship and prayer. It is meant as a tool for private devotions. Our goal shouldn't be as much to check readings off a list as to respond to the revelation God has given us.

3. If you skip one of the liturgies, or miss a day or even days, don't feel a need to catch back up. Begin again on the day's date. Hear from God's word. Converse with Him in prayer.

4. Process your readings and prayers in community. Talk about what God is teaching you with your family or roommates, your Missional Community, and DNA Group. Pray with and for one another. Consider even using this liturgy at times in those groups.

PRAYING THE BIBLE

Maintaining focus in prayer is difficult. In our media-saturated, smart phone age, it's so easy to get distracted. In addition, we often don't know what to pray. We end up saying the same phrases over and over. However, our method could be the problem, and it could be that God has already provided a way for us to converse with Him, a way that could help us maintain focus.

Don Whitney, in his helpful book, *Praying the Bible*, says this: "When you pray, pray through a passage of Scripture, particularly a psalm."¹ John Piper puts it this way: "Open the Bible, start reading it, and pause at every verse and turn it into a prayer."² Good relationships require good communication. Good communication needs both listening and speaking. The biblical pattern moves from revelation to response. He speaks to us in His word. We respond to Him in prayer. Praying the Bible helps us direct our focus. It also gives language to our prayers. As you read the passages provided for each day (and feel free to choose just one or a couple), respond to the Lord through what you read.

The Psalms can be especially helpful. In fact, they've been understood and utilized historically as a prayer book, as a worship guide for the church. Church father Athanasius once said, "Whatever your particular need or trouble, from this same book you can select a form of words to fit it."³ The Psalms were given to provide a language for our prayers, to teach us to pray. Luther once wrote, "As a teacher will compose letters or little speeches for his pupils to write to their parents, so by this book He prepares both the language and the mood in which we should address the Heavenly Father." The Psalms provide songs for all seasons. Their many genres give voice to the full range of human experience. We often think of praise when we think of this book, yet it is also full of lament. The Psalms teach us how to

process our hardest moments before the Lord, turning depression and doubt into trust. They don't just teach us to pray. They transform us as we do. As Christopher Ash puts it, "The Psalms not only train us to pray; they gradually reshape our affections and our aversions so that we love what we ought to love and hate what we ought to hate."⁴ Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote that the Psalms serve as a "children's primer," teaching us how to speak to God, serving to turn our speech and our affections toward Him.

At the heart of this Field Guide is this call to pray the Psalms. A 73-day plan is provided. As you pray through these biblical prayers (along with other parts of the Bible), here are some guidelines that may help you.

- 1. Don't feel** like you need to read every Psalm (or every biblical passage) every day. Read one that resonates with you. Respond to the Lord in prayer.
- 2. Meditate upon** the words of Scripture. That's what Christian meditation is - not emptying your mind, but rather filling it with God's truth.
- 3. You don't** have to understand every line or word to pray it back to God. This isn't Bible study but rather reading and responding.
- 4. Let the** words of the Psalm or passage drive you to Jesus. You'll often read words with which you'll have difficulty identifying. For example, the passages speaking of David's sufferings may make sense but might also be outside your personal experience.
- 5. As we** think of them pointing ultimately to Christ's sufferings, they can lead us to a time of thanksgiving in what Christ has done, as well as an opportunity to reflect upon His calling for our lives.

6. While sitting at a desk with Bible opened may be the ideal situation to utilize this guide, don't limit yourself to that. This guide's compact size, along with our ever-handy smartphones, can enable us to read anywhere. It works great on nature walks. It can even be utilized with an audio Bible on a commute. The goal again isn't to just "check things off your list," but rather commune with our living God.

MORNING PRAYER

THE CALL

Read from the following verses as a call to worship, as you prepare your heart for prayer.

Sunday: *O LORD, our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth! (Psalm 8:1, 9)*

Monday: *Our Redeemer—the LORD of hosts is his name—is the Holy One of Israel. (Isaiah 47:4)*

Tuesday: *There is none like you, O Lord; you are great and your name is great in might. Who would not fear you, O King of the nations? For this is your due; for among all the wise ones of the nations and in all their kingdoms, there is none like you. (Jeremiah 10:6-7)*

Wednesday: *For thus says the One who is high and lifted up, who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: "I dwell in the high and holy place, and also with him who is of a contrite and lowly spirit, to revive the spirit of the lowly, and to revive the heart of the contrite." (Isaiah 57:15)*

Thursday: *Who is like you, O LORD, among the gods? Who is like you, majestic in holiness, awesome in glorious deeds, doing wonders? (Exodus 15:11)*

Friday: *But the LORD is in his holy temple; let all the earth keep silence before him. (Habakkuk 2:20)*

Saturday: *The heavens declare the glory of God, and the sky above proclaims his handiwork. (Psalm 19:1)*

THE CONFESSION

Spend some time confessing your sins, acknowledging your need for the grace and love of Jesus, utilizing the prayer that follows.

Most merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We are truly sorry and we humbly repent. For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways, to the glory of your Name. Amen.⁵

THE GOSPEL

Meditate on one of the following verses, and lift it up in prayer, taking a few moments to remember what the Lord has done for us in Christ.

Sunday: *For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life. (John 3:16)*

Monday: *But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5:8)*

Tuesday: *For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit. (1 Peter 3:18)*

Wednesday: *For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast. (Ephesians 2:8-9)*

Thursday: *Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. (Isaiah 53:4-5)*

Friday: *But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. (Galatians 4:4-5)*

Saturday: *And they sang a new song, saying, "Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation." (Revelation 5:9)*

Father, through Your Son's perfect life and sacrificial death, I have peace with you. I'm no longer an orphan. I'm no longer a slave. I'm a son, a daughter of Yours, and I'm free. For all of this, I praise you. I thank you. In Christ's name, Amen.

THE PRAISES

Respond by praising the Lord for the good news of the gospel.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.⁶

THE PSALMS

Read one (or more) of the day's Psalms (pgs 16-39) slowly and meditatively.

THE READINGS

Pray and meditate utilizing one or more of the additional readings from the Old or New Testament (pgs 16-39).

THE APOSTLES' CREED

Read this historic creed, reciting these truths held by Christians throughout the ages and around the world.

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

THE LORD'S PRAYER

Read this prayer the Lord Jesus taught His disciples, slowly and meditatively.

Our Father, who is in heaven, hallowed be Your Name, Your kingdom come, Your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For Yours is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

THE INTERCESSION

Let the following prayer lead you into a time of intercession. Consult the table on page 40 for helps.

Show us your mercy, O Lord; And grant us your salvation. Clothe your ministers with righteousness; Let your people sing with joy.

Give peace, O Lord, in all the world; For only in you can we live in safety. Lord, keep this nation under your care; And guide us in the way of justice and truth.

Let your way be known upon earth; Your saving health among all nations. Let not the needy, O Lord, be forgotten; Nor the hope of the poor be taken away. Create in us clean hearts, O God; And sustain us by your Holy Spirit.⁷

THE BENEDICTION

Pray the following prayer of blessing as you embark on another day.

Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, to him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen. (Ephesians 3:20-21)

EVENING PRAYER

THE CALL

Read from the following verses as a call to worship, as you prepare your heart for prayer.

Sunday: *Exalt the LORD our God; worship at his footstool! Holy is he! (Psalm 99:5)*

Monday: *Lift up your heads, O gates! And be lifted up, O ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in. Who is this King of glory? The LORD, strong and mighty, the LORD, mighty in battle! (Psalm 24:7-8)*

Tuesday: *There is none holy like the LORD: for there is none besides you; there is no rock like our God. (1 Samuel 2:2)*

Wednesday: *Holy, holy, holy is the LORD of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory! (Isaiah 6:3)*

Thursday: *The LORD is in his holy temple; the LORD's throne is in heaven; his eyes see, his eyelids test the children of man. (Psalm 11:4)*

Friday: *Ascribe to the LORD, O families of the peoples, ascribe to the LORD glory and strength! Ascribe to the LORD the glory due his name; bring an offering, and come into his courts! Worship the LORD in the splendor of holiness; tremble before him, all the earth! (Psalm 96:7-9)*

Saturday: *I am the LORD, your Holy One, the Creator of Israel, your King. (Isaiah 43:15)*

THE CONFESSION

Spend some time confessing your sins, acknowledging your need for the grace and love of Jesus, utilizing the prayer that follows.

Almighty and most merciful Father; We have erred, and strayed from your ways like lost sheep.

We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against your holy laws.

We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; And we have done those things which we ought not to have done; And there is no health in us.

But you, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare those, O God, who confess their faults.

Restore those who are penitent, according to your promises declared to humanity in Christ Jesus our Lord. And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous and sober life. To the Glory of your holy Name. Amen.⁸

THE GOSPEL

Meditate on one of the following verses. Pray the included prayer, taking a few moments to remember what the Lord has done for us in Christ.

Sunday: *The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners, of whom I am the foremost. (1 Timothy 1:15)*

Monday: *For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. (2 Corinthians 5:21)*

Tuesday: *Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a curse for us—for it is written, “Cursed is everyone who is hanged on a tree.” (Galatians 3:13)*

Wednesday: *For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus. (Romans 3:23-24)*

Thursday: *My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world. (1 John 2:1-2)*

Friday: *In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace. (Ephesians 1:7)*

Saturday: *He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we might die to sin and live to righteousness. By his wounds you have been healed. For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls.*
(1 Peter 2:24-25)

Father, I praise you that you have conquered death. You have raised me with Christ. One day, my body, too, will be raised. You have placed me in a family. I will dwell with them - and You - forever, in a renewed creation. Thank you for this great hope. In the name of Jesus, Amen.

Respond by praising the Lord for the good news of the gospel.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit: as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

THE NICENE CREED

Read this historic creed, reciting these truths held by Christians throughout the ages and around the world.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, begotten from the Father before all ages, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of the same essence as the Father.

He was crucified for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried. The third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures.

AN OUTLINE FOR DNA GROUPS

DNA Groups made up of three people, by gender, who come together regularly, before God's word, to discover, nurture, and act. All members should come each week ready to discuss what they've discovered and learned from God's word, how they've struggled in sin and unbelief, and where the Spirit has led them to repentance and faith.

DISCOVER. Led by the Holy Spirit, study the Bible and ask the Four Questions. The goal is to teach the head so that each person either learns or is reminded of the truth of the gospel.

THE FOUR QUESTIONS:

- 1. Who is God? What does the text say about the character and nature of God?*
- 2. What has God done? What does the text say about the work of God, His gospel?*
- 3. Who are we in light of that? What does the text say about our identity in Jesus?*
- 4. How do we live? In light of all of this, how should it change the way we live?*

NURTURE. Led by the Holy Spirit, seek to repent and believe in the gospel together. The goal is to shepherd the heart so that each person is brought to repentance and renewed faith every time a DNA group meets.

NURTURING ONE ANOTHER:

- 1. Ask good questions of one another.*
- 2. Listen for the heart, trying to discern idols.*
- 3. Speak the truth in love to one another.*
- 4. Seek to "walk in the light" before God and one another (1 Jn. 1:5-10).*







ACT. Led by the Holy Spirit, listen and obey as God calls us to bear fruit in keeping with repentance. The goal is to empower the hands so that, in light of their repentance, each person knows what to do and who to tell every time the group meets.

TWO QUESTIONS TO ASK:

- 1. What do you want me to do?*
- 2. Who do you want me to tell?*

STUDYING THE BIBLE TOGETHER

Read a passage of God's word together, and ask, and discuss, the following questions, represented by their corresponding symbols.¹⁰

	What shines from this passage? What impacts you the most? What draws your attention?
	What questions do you have? What seems difficult to understand?
	How can we apply this passage to our lives? Where do you see its relevance today?
	How do you see Jesus and the gospel in this text? What do you learn about our identity in Him?
	What seems to be the main point of this section of Scripture? What is God - through the human author - wanting us to hear?
	How can you share the message of this Bible passage? Who comes to mind that needs to hear God's words here?

(REBIR)TH ABIDING IN CHRIST IN A BROKEN WORLD¹¹

1. Prayerfully work from top to bottom of the left column. This is (REBIR)TH DOWN.
2. Read and reflect on a passage of scripture. Work through it more than once if possible.

EXPERIENCING THE FALL How my realities impact me in THE FLESH.	
(R)EFLECTION	? What have I been thinking about or dwelling on? What lies am I believing?
(E)XPERIENCE in heart and soul	? Given my reality, what am I experiencing in my heart and soul?
(B)ODILY experience	? Given my reality, what am I experiencing in my body? (shallow breathing, not sleeping, stomachache, tension, headaches, etc.)
(I)NVITATION	? What do I want or desire in my flesh?
(R)ELATIONSHIP between God, me	? Given my reality, how do I see God and relate to him in my flesh?

- Prayerfully work from top to bottom of the right column. This is (REBIR)TH UP.
- Abide in Jesus. Allow the realities of His love and grace to transform the realities of the fall and your flesh.

EXPERIENCING JESUS

How my realities impact me in CHRIST.

? How is God shepherding me from this passage?

? Given the truths and realities in this passage, what am I experiencing in my heart & soul? (God's presence, peace, comfort, love, etc.)

? How is my body responding to my reflections?

? How is God inviting me to live differently?

? What does all the above say about God and his relationship with me?
