

## Sunday Resources for June 28, 2020

**Lesson**: *God Makes A Way* from the Jesus Storybook Blble, pages 92-99 Moses And The Red Sea, from Exodus 3-13

**Aim**: To understand that God has done amazing miracles to rescue his people and that we can trust him.

## Questions:

- Did God's people escape Egypt? Yes, but they were lost, they didn't know the way to the special promised land.
- How did God lead his people? God promised to lead his people. He used a big cloud and a pillar of smoke to lead them and protect them.
- Why were God's people worried about the Red Sea? It was difficult to cross, and they didn't think they could do it. They were still being chased by Pharaoh after he changed his mind about releasing them.
- Were God's people able to save themselves? *No! There was no way around or through the Red Sea.* They were so afraid.
- What did Moses do to encourage the Israelites? He reminded them that they couldn't do anything. That God would rescue them. Moses told the people to trust God.
- How did God rescue his people? God hid his people. He used the winds to move the water. He made a path for the Israelites to cross on dry ground. The Egyptians couldn't follow.

**Review**: When God rescued his people, they trusted God. We too can trust God who rescues his people. We can trust Jesus, the Great Rescuer.

**Reflect**: Every story in the Bible whispers Jesus' name. Even though we didn't hear Jesus' name in this story, we see God do great miracles and learn about the Great Rescue that was to come. What did we discover about Jesus from today's story?

**Prayer:** Thank you God for the amazing rescue that you planned for us. Help me to trust you, the God, who rescues people. Help me to trust you, the Great Rescuer.

## **Activities:**

★ Make a loaf pan of red Jell-O. Print out little people. (You can glue them on craft sticks if you want.)

Part the "Red Sea" by stacking Jell-O to the sides of the pan. Have the stick people walk through the parted Jell-O.
