

Sunday Resources for March 29, 2020

Lesson: *The Servant King*, from the Jesus Storybook Blble, pages 286-293 The Last Supper, from Mark 14 and John 13-14

Aim: To understand that Jesus came as a servant, and only he can clean our sinful hearts.

Questions:

- Do kings or teachers usually wash anyone's feet? *No, kings or teachers do not wash anyone's feet. That is the servant's job.*
- Why did Jesus wash people's feet? *He is the servant-king.*
- What does Jesus command the disciples to do? Wash each other's feet.
- Did Jesus only wash the feet of the disciples that were nice to him? *No, he washed the disciples feet because he loved them. He washed all of their feet, even if they were not nice (like Judas).*

Review: Jesus is the <u>servant king</u> and the Passover Lamb. He knew he had to die to rescue us. *Jesus came as a servant, and only he can clean my sinful heart.*

Reflect: What did we discover about Jesus from today's story?

Prayer: Thank you Jesus for coming to save me and make me clean. Help me serve others and love others the way you have loved me.

Activities:

- ★ Soak a tarnished penny in Coke or vinegar to display how Jesus came to clean our hearts.
- ★ Spent time washing each other's feet, parents to kids and then kids to parents. Talk about how Jesus came to serve us a nd show us how to serve one another.
